PROSTHETIC HAND PROJECT

Greetings from Nairobi **Utumishi Rotary Club**.

We are pleased to advise you that in conjunction with the Rotary Club of Pleasant Hills U.S.A , we will be conducting a Prosthetic Hand Camp in Nairobi from 8th November to 18th November.

This is similar to Jaipur prosthetic leg and foot project and is actually a artificial limb (hand). The prosthetic hand enables people without hands benefit and become of value to the society and work better. The hand is a simple functioning replacement and will be fitted free of charge.

We at Utumishi Club are seeking assistance from you and members of your Rotary Club in spreading the word around and also to make this project a success we need your club's help to recruit recipients, ie enough below the elbow amputees.

Ideally each recipient must have on the remaining limb for which the hand will be installed, atleast 4 – 6 inches (10 – 15 centimeters) below the elbow and a relatively straight / clean end on that limb so that the hand can be installed properly.

A team of 8 members is coming down from U. S. A in the first week of November.
